Ron Humanick- 528 W. South Street. Signed in and was recognized to speak. Ron stated to the Council that he is in favor of the fire pits. Ron said that sitting around the fire pit, cooking a hotdog, having a good time is very relaxing. However, Ron understands the complaints of burning of garbage, etc. Ron is requesting the Council not make a quick decision, and to think of alternative means to enforce the ordinance. Councilor Bartholomew stated this meeting is just a fact-finding meeting and there will not be a vote any actual ordinance at this time.

9. UNIFINISHED BUSINESS:

President Reed stated there had been a vote at the last regular Council meeting to go ahead with a no burn ordinance and the vote was a tie. At that time, there were 6 Council members and the mayor was not in attendance. Mayor Niedermeyer voted to keep the ordinance as is and not to have a no burn ordinance. Councilor Schnaars clarified that Mayor Niedermeyer's vote is no. Manager Stevens stated that the motion fails 4 to 3. Mayor Niedermeyer feels people should have the right to burn.

<u>Richard Fogelman</u> – Oakhurst Drive. Mr. Fogelman spoke concerning the no burn ordinance. The Council assured him that the ordinance would remain as is.

Resident on Arbor Lane- Thanked Mayor Niedermeyer for his support not to have a no burn ordinance.

<u>Bruce Redline</u> – 398 So. Walnut Street - Bruce asked why the burning issue was brought up. President Reed stated that over the years, there has been concern that people are not considerate of their neighbors and burn anything.

Resident on Oakhurst Drive said he had a lot of work done to make a nice fire pit for enjoyment.

John McCormick – 738 Arbor Lane. John had noted there was a possible ban on burning everything. John's has plenty of property where there is not concern for burning. John feels this issue will come up again, and has suggested to possibly look at zones as to who can burn or not burn, or issue permits. Councilor Bartholomew informed him that his committee is reviewing old ordinances.

Andreas Hassold - 1067 Pine Tree Drive. Andreas asked the Council if the agendas could be placed on the Slatington Borough website and reviewed by the public ahead of time.
